experiences of lesbian bisexual, queer and transgender parented stepfamilies before and after marriage equality. *Queer Stepfamilies*, which highlights the complex

dynamics that influence parenting under these

circumstances and the ingenious ways respondents make their families work.

The talk will focus on the strategies that mixed-race and racially minoritized stepfamilies led by lesbian, bisexual transgender or queer parents used to make themselves intelligible as family to others.
